was not unexpected. As we continue to take care of Veterans and Families, remember YOU and YOURS fall into that category. Be sure you take time to take care of the yourself and your family.


As always, there will be lots of opportunities to celebrate Independence Day.



SHORT HISTORY OF MOPH IN TUCSON: A

MOPH Chapter has served Tucson veterans since 1933. Arizona Chapter 73 in Tucson was chartered in 1933. Tucson was the first location in the state of Arizona to have a MOPH Chapter and was the only chapter in the state until 1939. The charter had 12 signatures of which General John J. Pershing was number 1. General Pershing resided in Tucson part time at that time. After General Pershing's death in 1948 Arizona Chapter 73 requested to be renamed as the General John J. Pershing Chapter 73. A chapter in Ohio was already named after General Pershing but they agreed to give up their chapter name and National approved Arizona Chapter 73 being renamed in 1950. General John J. Pershing Chapter 73 remained active until about 1970. In April 1980 Ft. Lowell Chapter 442 was chartered. The chapter was named after Ft. Lowell, which was an Army post near Tucson that was active from 1873 to 1891 and had a major role in the Apache Wars. In 1981 Ft. Lowell Chapter 442 hosted the MOPH National Convention at the DoubleTree Inn. 400 MOPH members from across the Nation attend the convention in Tucson from Aug 18 to Aug 22. In June of 1982 the chapter hosted the Department of Arizona convention. Summary of history is from news articles in the Arizona Daily Star & Tucson Citizen archives.



STAYING SAFE IN THE HEAT:

Staying Safe in the Heat: Know the Signs of Heat-Related Injuries. As temperatures rise, so does the risk of serious heat-related injuries. Every year, thousands of people are affected by extreme heat, which can quickly turn dangerous if warning signs are ignored.

Heat exhaustion is a common heat injury that happens when the body loses too much water and salt through sweating. Symptoms may include heavy sweating, weakness, dizziness, headache, nausea, and muscle cramps. If not treated, heat exhaustion can progress to a more serious condition.

Heat stroke is a life-threatening emergency that occurs when the body's temperature rises rapidly, and it can no longer cool itself. Key signs of heat stroke include confusion, loss of consciousness, hot and dry skin, and a body temperature above 103°F (39.4°C). Without immediate medical treatment, heat stroke can cause permanent organ damage or even death.

Dehydration is another major concern in hot weather. When the body loses more fluids than it takes in, it can lead to dry mouth, extreme thirst, dark urine, fatigue, and dizziness. Severe dehydration requires medical attention.

Prevention is key:

- Drink plenty of water, even if you don't feel thirsty.
- Avoid strenuous activity during the hottest parts of the day.
- Wear lightweight, light-colored clothing.
- Take breaks in shaded or air-conditioned areas.

THINKING ABOUT DEATH: Have you thought about your death or your spouse's? No. Well, you should. This is not another article on suicide awareness and prevention. As Veterans, we talk a lot about our DD-214. Do we know where it is? Does our family know where it is? What about our VA rating? Same basic questions – do you and your family know where your VA claim submission or the award letter is, what the rating is, what the rating is for, etc.


What we don't talk about, or at least not in most groups, is all the "other stuff." If you died suddenly and unexpectedly, would your spouse, children, or executor know where to start? Here are just a few things YOU need to do sooner rather than later. It is your responsibility to make sure the impact of your passing is mitigated to the best of your ability. Here are some personal thoughts to help you get started.

- 1. Make a list! There are several places you can look for examples. If you need a starting point, just Google "what needs to be done when a veteran dies." Review the list with the family. Make sure they can read and understand what the list is for and what needs to be done for each item on the list.
- **2.** Make sure your "instructions" are clear using language the family will easily understand. Don't just

 Check on older adults, children, and pets who are more vulnerable to heat-related illnesses.

Knowing these symptoms and acting quickly can save lives. If you or someone around you shows signs of heat stroke, call 911 immediately and move the person to a cooler place while waiting for help.

STATE LEGISLATION: These three bills are still awaiting action from the Rules Committee in both houses:

- HB2672: Property Tax Exemption for Disabled Veterans – Under review by the Senate Rules Committee, chaired by Senator Farnsworth.
- SB1155: Pay Equity for USPHS/NOAA Under review by the House Rules Committee chaired by Rep. Hendrix.
- SB1704: VDF Monies for State Veterans Homes – Under review by the House Rules Committee, chaired by Rep. Hendrix

VA TRAVEL VOUCHER FORM: As a reminder, the old beneficiary travel voucher claim form has officially expired. The new forms are now out for use. The forms can also be found online at https://www.va.gov/find-forms/about-form-10-3542/.

VA COMMUNITY CARE: VA Community Care Just Got Easier. The Department of Veterans Affairs has changed its process for veterans to get medical care from non-VA providers, removing a requirement that a referral to community care be reviewed by another VA doctor. The VA announced that it is enacting a provision of the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act that will help ease veterans' access to medical services from private providers. The law, signed in December by then-President Joe Biden, prohibits VA administrators from overriding a VA doctor's referral for a patient to get outside care. More info is at this link.

MY HEALTHEVET & VA.GOV TRANSITION:

The VA's patient portal, My HealtheVet, is moving to VA.gov. With the new My HealtheVet on VA.gov portal, Veterans will have a more secure, single online location to manage their health care and other VA benefits and services.

As of January 31, 2025, Veterans are no longer able to sign in using My HealtheVet user ID and password. The two-remaining sign-in options will be Login.gov, which offers streamlined set up and integration with other federal services like TSA Precheck and FEMA, and ID.me, which provides additional verification methods, including video calls, and can be

used for military discounts.

BILLS IN CONGRESS: The Rural Veterans

Transportation to Care Act (S. 784/H.R. 1733), aims to improve transportation services for veterans living in rural areas by expanding eligibility to county veterans service organizations and tribal organizations, thereby broadening the scope of entities that can receive a Highly Rural Transportation Grant from the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). The bill would also raise the maximum amount of funding granted for the purchase of Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)-compliant vehicles. Currently, 2.7 million veterans reside in rural areas and many encounter barriers and challenges when accessing VA health care. One of the primary challenges is the limited transportation options available to these veterans. This legislation would expand and modify the VA's grant program to provide alternative transportation options to veterans in rural or highly rural communities.

Contact your representative or senator to voice support for this legislation.

DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE: Military retirees are required to update their Uniformed Services Identification (USID) cards to the new Next Generation USID card by December 31, 2025. The paper-based USID cards with indefinite expiration dates will no longer be accepted after this date.

It's important for military retirees, dependents, & surviving spouses to know these old forms of ID will not be valid to access a military installation, and you will need issuance of the NextGen ID card.

There are several ways to make an appointment to get a new ID card. (1). You can visit the RAPIDS ID Card Office Locator website to find the closest office and either call them to make an appointment or (2). schedule your own appointment using the website.
