- One important By-Law change will take effect in the fiscal year 2026-2027. Life Member payment percentages will change to 20% National, 40% Department, and 40% to chapter.
- The 990's non-profit status was a heated discussion with National stating that Non-Profit Status will be restored by the end of this year.
- We have a new National Commander, Tracey Brown, Sr. Vice Commander Francesca Lowe, and Jr. Vice Commander Jo Keller.

This is the first time the MOPH has a female National Commander and may be the first time that a National Organization has 3 top line female officers. Congratulations.

- Next year's National Convention will be held in North Carolina. Details are still pending.

NEW MOPH NATIONAL COMMANDER:





Department Website Is Now Live: The newly rebuilt **Department of Arizona website** is officially live at www.mophaz.org. Built with a mobile-first design, it's optimized for use on phones and tablets while remaining fully functional on desktop. Key features include:

- Search Function (magnifying glass icon) to find pages by keyword
- Events Calendar with updates from newsletters and chapter submissions
- Blog Section for programs, news, and recognition stories
- Embedded Facebook Feed with live updates
- Security Enhancements with regular backups and no ads

Department Email System Development

We're currently rolling out a **department-wide email system** and have started working with the adjutant, Patriot Larry Leighton, and Jr. Vice-Commander, Patriot John Moore, to test and refine it for full implementation. Starting in **September**, each chapter will be asked to:

• Identify who needs an organizational email address

These will be formatted as firstname.lastname@ch####.mophaz.org. Each user will log in once and can send/receive messages from the appropriate chapter/role inboxes as needed.

• Confirm what roles should have dedicated emails

Positions like Commander, Adjutant, and Finance can have **shared inboxes** that allow multiple users access, ensuring continuity and consistency when leadership changes.

• Decide whether to adopt or opt out of the full system

If your chapter prefers not to use organizational emails, I can still create a **distribution list** to streamline communication from the department to chapter leadership. However, distribution lists cannot send replies or operate as official chapter emails.

Why Use the New Email System?

- Reduces spam
- Enhance data security
- Prevents impersonation of personal emails
- Simplifies transitions between leadership roles

- All requests and content updates must be submitted via email to webmaster@mophaz.org.
- Please allow a minimum 2 business-day turnaround for all changes, updates, or support.

Scheduled Out-of-Office: I will be offline from **July 23 through August 10** with the exception of uploading the Department newsletter. Please plan accordingly if you anticipate needing website or email support during that time. I will respond to all requests in the week of August 11th.

If you have questions, want help setting up your chapter's website or email accounts, or need assistance navigating the new system, don't hesitate to email me and I will get back to you as soon as possible.





PURPLE HEART DAY: August 7th is the Purple Heart Day Observance at Williams Monument Park in Williams, AZ at 11:00am.

PURPLE HEART DAY

A "Purple heart Day" Commemoration Ceremony will be held on Thursday August, 7 2025, at 11:00 AM at Williams Monument Park.

All are invited to join members of The American Legion, VFW, Military Order of the Purple Heart, Marine Corps League, Vietnam Veterans of America and Disabled American Veterans who attend.

Every County in Arizona is officially a "Purple Heart County" and Arizona is officially a "Purple Heart State", and The City of Williams became a Purple Heart City on August 7th 2018.

The purpose of this ceremony is to recognize the recipients of the Purple Heart medal, both in memory and those who are still with us.





On August 7, 1782 at his headquarters in Newburgh, NY. General George Washington, The Commander in Chief of the Continental Army, ordered the creation of a Badge of Military Merit. The badge consisted of a heart shaped piece of cloth, with the word MERIT embroidered in silver across the front. It was awarded to soldiers who showed "not only instances of unusual gallantry in battle, but also extraordinary fidelity and services in any way". The Purple Heart is the oldest active military decoration still awarded in the United States, recognizing those wounded or killed in combat.

Thanks to Army Gen. Douglas MacArthur, the Purple Heart officially received its modern-day look and name. A few years later in 1942, President Roosevelt and the War Department further defined the qualifications for receiving a Purple Heart, designating it for those who were wounded or killed in action, and to be presented both active and posthumously.

its own distinctive purple military style cap. Chapter caps are purple with white piping and white lettering, with a George Washington emblem sewn on it.

The chapter number and the words "Life Member" may be added with white letters as appropriate. Order for \$29.95 at Keystone Uniform Cap.

PURPLE HEART LICENSES PLATES: Vehicle license tax exemption is available for PH veterans. On



registration of a vehicle, if the veteran submits satisfactory proof to ADOT that the person is a veteran and a bona fide Purple Heart medal recipient

and was honorably discharged the registration tax fee is waived. Can only be used on one vehicle. Specialty plate and personalization fees still apply.

FREE TUITION FOR VETERAN SPOUSES:

Spouses of honorably discharged veterans enrolled at an Arizona public university, or a participating community college are eligible to receive free tuition on a first-come, first-served basis. Learn more at the <u>AZ Board of Regents</u>.

STATE LEGISLATION: These three bills are still awaiting action from the Rules Committee in both houses:

- HB2672: Property Tax Exemption for Disabled Veterans – Under review by the Senate Rules Committee, chaired by Senator Farnsworth.
- SB1155: Pay Equity for USPHS/NOAA Under review by the House Rules Committee chaired by Rep. Hendrix.
- SB1704: VDF Monies for State Veterans Homes – Under review by the House Rules Committee, chaired by Rep. Hendrix

VA VETERANS' ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has announced plans to extend eligibility for its Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers (PCAFC) to include more so-called "legacy" Veterans and their caregivers, a move expected to benefit thousands who served before 2001. More information is at this link.

VA TRAVEL VOUCHER FORM: As a reminder, the old beneficiary travel voucher claim form has officially expired. The new forms are now out for use. The forms can also be found online at https://www.va.gov/find-forms/about-form-10-3542/.

VA COMMUNITY CARE: VA Community Care Just Got Easier. The Department of Veterans Affairs has changed its process for veterans to get medical care from non-VA providers, removing a requirement that a referral to community care be reviewed by another VA doctor. The VA announced that it is enacting a provision of the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act that will help ease veterans' access to medical services from private providers. The law, signed in December by then-President Joe Biden, prohibits VA administrators from overriding a VA doctor's referral for a patient to get outside care. More info is at this link.

MY HEALTHEVET & VA.GOV TRANSITION:

The VA's patient portal, My HealtheVet, is moving to VA.gov. With the new My HealtheVet on VA.gov portal, Veterans will have a more secure, single online location to manage their health care and other VA benefits and services.

As of January 31, 2025, Veterans are no longer able to sign in using My HealtheVet user ID and password. The two-remaining sign-in options will be Login.gov, which offers streamlined set up and integration with other federal services like TSA Precheck and FEMA, and ID.me, which provides additional verification methods, including video calls, and can be used for military discounts.



DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE: Military retirees are required to update their Uniformed Services Identification (USID) cards to the new Next Generation

December 31, 2025.
The paper-based
USID cards with
indefinite expiration
dates will no longer
be accepted after this
date.

It's important for

military retirees, dependents, & surviving spouses to know these old forms of ID will not be valid to access a military installation, and you will need issuance of the NextGen ID card.
