Greetings Patriots, Hello Patriots.

Hope everybody enjoyed their summer. It's time for the chapters that were dark during the summer to start up again, and for the Department, and its chapters, to start working on their programs for the new year.

I know everyone realizes that we need new membership if we are going to continue to survive and that I am preaching to the choir. But that is what Department Senior Vice Commanders do. For every new active member that we can recruit it eases the burden of the existing active members. One way I



have found out that is good for recruiting is to wear Purple Heart items and especially Military Order of the Purple Heart clothing items. Whether it's a shirt, hat, or jacket, Purple Heart recipients recognize the Logo. It does work. For example, this past spring Chapter 691 had an outing at Lake Pleasant and while on the boat I was approached by a Purple Heart recipient who noticed all the clothing and hats. After talking to him for a bit I referred him to a Chapter 793 officer who proceeded to give the gentleman more detailed information and how to sign up.

If we are visible in our communities, we will be able to recruit new members. If possible, try and keep a CURRENT application on your person, and one in your vehicle, because you never know when you will meet up with a potential member. Another way is if you see someone wearing a Purple Heart hat, approach them, thank them for their service, and ask them if they are a member of the MOPH. Tell

them about some of the programs we have and offer them an application. Inform them that they can join online.

Your Department is finalizing a new incentive program for new active members. If the new member is active, for a yet to be determined time, then that Chapter can petition the Department for a membership fee rebate of \$100.00. If the chapter matches that then the new member will be refunded a \$200.00 amount which was their membership fee, essentially giving them free membership for being active. Once again this is still in the final stages of being implemented.

As I was editing the next issue of the Purple Heart Magazine, I realized I had been missing a day that has significant impact on the entire population and particularly the military. It's been a long time since I was in school and I don't remember being taught much about it then. Constitution Day recognized on September 17th is the one I've missed but I included it in this issue of the PHM. Here's just a portion of that article but I encourage everyone to read up on this important day in our history.

"A Call to Reflection

On Constitution Day, let us remember the timeless values enshrined in that document: freedom, justice, and unity. Let us honor those who risked — and still risk—everything to uphold them. And let us take pride, as Purple Heart recipients and patriotic Americans, in knowing that our sacrifices have preserved the very foundation of the republic. September 17th is not just another date on the calendar—it is the heartbeat of our democracy. And for those of us who have shed blood in its defense, it is deeply personal."



BADGE OF MILITARY MERIT SOCIETY: In case you missed it, the Badge of Military Merit Society (BMMS) was created to help perserve the legacy of the Purple Heart Medal and the Miliary Order of the Purple Heart. WE have over 55k members and associate members on the National roster as of June 30th. If only 25k members would sign up to donate just \$5 each month, together we would raise over \$1.5 million for the Order's programs each year! Join at this link.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP VERIFICATION: I, and the Chapter Adjutants, have to make sure our Life Member Verification Reports are ACCURATE and submitted to National before October 1st. You can do your part by keeping your personal profile up to date. If you need help to verify your profile is up to date, any Chapter or Department officer can help.

National Suicide Prevention Month: Suicide prevention begins with connection. Small acts—listening without judgment, offering to meet for coffee, or simply making a phone call—can change the course of someone's day, or even their life. National Suicide Prevention Month is more than awareness—it is a call to action. As Purple Heart recipients, we embody courage in the face of adversity. That same courage must be brought to bear in breaking the silence around mental health and suicide.

Let us honor our fallen by fighting for the living. Let us prove, once again, that we are stronger together than alone.

WEBMASTER'S CORNER - STAY ALERT FOR EMAIL SCAMS:

As your Department Webmaster, I want to remind everyone to stay vigilant when it comes to suspicious emails, especially those that appear to come from fellow officers or trusted contacts.



Scam emails are on the rise, and many now use email spoofing—a tactic where a scammer sends an email that looks like it's from someone you know. These messages often request gift cards, wire transfers, personal information, or include links that lead to malicious websites. Don't take the bait.

Here are a few quick tips to protect yourself and your chapter:

- Double-check the sender's address. Just because it says it's from "John Doe" doesn't mean it is. Hover your mouse over the sender's name to see the actual email address.
- Never send gift cards or passwords by email. No legitimate MOPH officer will ever request gift cards, sensitive information, or money via email without prior direct conversation.
- Watch for urgency or odd language. Messages that say, "Are you available right now?" or "I need a quick favor but can't talk" are classic signs of a scam.
- Don't click unverified links or attachments. If something feels off, verify the sender before clicking any links or opening files, especially if the email is unexpected or vague.
- Report suspicious messages. Forward questionable emails to: <u>webmaster@mophaz.org</u> so, I can help investigate and alert others if needed.

To improve communication and reduce these threats, we're rolling out a department-wide email system in September. New email addresses (like firstname.lastname@ch####.mophaz.org) will help confirm legitimacy and provide secure, role-based access to official chapter communications.

If your chapter hasn't set up your email or website, I'm happy to help. Just reach out to webmaster@mophaz.org and I'll get you started.

Stay alert. Stay safe. Stay scam smart.

The veteran, his wife, and 2 under the age of 7 children were living in his F-150 truck in the record August heat.

Patriot Chuck Byers vetted the veteran and the

chapter's officers approved \$569 and placed the family in a motel for a week. Visibly moved, the



veteran pledged to follow instructions and cooperate fully with all coordinated efforts. He expressed deep gratitude, noting that his family wished to send a photo to the Military Order of the Purple Heart as a gesture of eternal thanks. For the first time in weeks, the family looked toward

tomorrow with hope—not from the cab of a truck, but from safe shelter—confident that through honor, duty, and collective perseverance, they could achieve a lasting exit from homelessness. AZDVS, the MACV Foundation and other agencies are actively working to help this veteran in need.

PARKS: Did you know Arizona State Parks offers a special discount program just for veterans and active-duty military? It's their way of saying **"Thank**"



you" for your service—and it's a great reason to get outside and enjoy

everything our state has to offer. If you're a 100% service-connected disabled veteran, you can get an annual pass for FREE. That means unlimited day-use entry to all 30 state parks for you and up to three adults in the same vehicle. If you're an Arizona resident veteran with any service-connected disability, you qualify for 50% off the annual pass. And if you're active-duty military, you get free day-use admission any time!

What's Included?

The pass covers day-use access—so you can hike, picnic, and explore places like Lost Dutchman, Dead Horse Ranch, Kartchner Caverns, and so many more. (Camping and special tours aren't included, but the parks offer great deals on those too.)

How to Get Your Pass

It's easy:

- 1. Fill out an application online or at any state park. Go to the AZ State Parks Website.
- Show proof of Arizona residency and your VA disability rating (or your military ID if you're active duty).
- 3. Submit it and start planning your next adventure!

VA COMMUNITY CARE: VA Community Care Just Got Easier. The Department of Veterans Affairs has changed its process for veterans to get medical care from non-VA providers, removing a requirement that a referral to community care be reviewed by another VA doctor. The VA announced that it is enacting a provision of the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act that will help ease veterans' access to medical services from private providers. The law, signed in December by then-President Joe Biden, prohibits VA administrators from overriding a VA doctor's

FEES: Vehicle license tax exemption is available



for PH veterans. On registration of a vehicle, if the veteran submits satisfactory proof to ADOT that the person is a veteran

and a bona fide Purple Heart medal recipient and was honorably discharged the registration tax fee is waived. Can only be used on one vehicle. Specialty plate and personalization fees still apply.
