

ANGEL TREES FOR VETERANS: Sun City West's Sundome Plaza has once again become a hub of holiday generosity as the Angel Trees for Veterans program returns to brighten the season for veterans living in VA Hospitals and Living Centers in Phoenix and Prescott as well as transition homes like M.A.N.A., U.S. Vets, and Veterans First and the State of Arizona Nursing Home.

Seven Christmas trees are placed at various locations throughout the plaza. Each tree is decorated with simple paper tags—"I would like" tags—bearing specific requests from veterans who reside in VA medical and residential facilities. Shoppers could select a tag, purchase the requested item, and return the wrapped gift to the store listed on the tag. Many of the requests are humble and practical. Many tags ask for basic cleaning supplies so veterans living in transition homes can do their part to keep shared spaces clean and comfortable. Others ask for gift cards, giving veterans the dignity and independence to choose their own gifts on rare trips outside their facilities. Gift cards also allow facility staff to celebrate birthdays and other special occasions for residents who might not otherwise receive anything special that day.

Corte Bella Vets, a veteran support organization from nearby Corte Bella, organizes the project. It is managed by chapter 691, **Patriot Jim Starkman and his wife Karen.** Each Christmas tree prominently displays the flags of the United States' Uniformed Services—Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, and Space Force—alongside the American flag, creating a powerful visual reminder of the men and women the community is honoring.

Community support has grown each year. This year, more than **3,000 "I would like to have" tags** will hang from the branches. **Jim and Karen** personally ensure that tags are replenished every couple of days. Once shoppers purchase the requested gift, they wrap it, amd return it to the designated Sundome Plaza store printed on the tag. From there, volunteers step in to handle the logistics of sorting and delivery.

Volunteers from American Legion Post 94 (Sun City West), Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapter 691 (Sun Cities Chapter), and the Corte Bella Vets work together to gather the gifts, separate them by facility, and prepare them for delivery. The gifts are then delivered to the VA Hospitals and Living Centers in Phoenix and Prescott on December 16 and 17. Volunteers prepared the trees for this year's season.

The business community has also stepped up in a big way. The **Happy Valley Home Depot** donates more than **60 packing and shipping boxes** each year, along with the use of a moving truck to ensure the gifts are transported safely and efficiently.

Thanks to the generosity of Sun City West and surrounding communities, the Angel Trees for Veterans program now delivers an estimated \$70,000 to \$80,000 worth of gifts each year. These gifts support veterans in **five** VA Hospitals and Living Centers in Phoenix and Prescott, reminding them that they are not forgotten and that their service is deeply appreciated.



PROCLAMATION

DECLARING NOVEMBER 2025
Purple Heart Nation Month

WHEREAS, from time immemorial, the Diné people have held sacred the way of the Warrior - those who rise in courage, protect the people, and walk in the way of Hózhó, balance, and strength for the well-being of the Nation

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation holds in the highest respect the men and women of our Nation who have served in the Armed Forces of the United States, whose bravery, endurance, and sacrifice have carried forward the teachings of our ancestors - to defend the land, the people, and the way of life given to us by the Holy People and

WHEREAS, the Purple Heart Medal, first established by General George Washington in 1782 as the Badge of Military Merit, is a sacred symbol of the blood, pain, and sacrifice endured by warriors who were wounded or gave their lives in the defense of freedom; and

WHEREAS, many Diné warriors - including the revered Navajo Code Talkers, whose sacred language became a shield and a weapon that could not be broken - have stood with honor in every major conflict, carrying the spirit of their clans, their prayers, and their people in tho battle; and

WHEREAS, the Navajo Nation acknowledges with deep reverence those of our people who have been wounded in battle, and the families who have carried that burden, whose hearts have known both pride and sorrow in the service of this great Nation; and

WHEREAS, the Diné believe that those who sacrifice for the people must always be remembered in ceremony, in story, and in heart, so that balance and harmony - Hózhó - may continue within our land and among our future en

NOW THEREFORE, I, DR. BUU NYGREN, President of the Navajo Nation, by the sacred trust placed in me by the Diné people, hereby proclaim November as PURPLE HEART NATION MONTH. The Navajo Nation will honor and remember all Purple Heart recipients and Diné warriors, living and departed, by keeping their names, stories, and sacrifices alive through ecremony, education, and community gatherings that strengthen the bonds of Ké and honor the spirit of Warriors within us all. May the path of our warriors continue in beauty - in Hózhó.



VA COMMUNITY CARE: VA Community Care Just Got Easier. The Department of Veterans Affairs has changed its process for veterans to get medical care from non-VA providers, removing a requirement that a referral to community care be reviewed by another VA doctor. The VA announced that it is enacting a provision of the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act that will help ease veterans' access to medical services from private providers. The law, signed in December by then-President Joe Biden, prohibits VA administrators from overriding a VA doctor's referral for a patient to get outside care. More info is at this link.








OPERATIONS ORDER: 12-01-25

Subject: Christmas

- 1. An official visit by General Santa (NMI) Claus is expected at this headquarters on 25 December 2025. The following instructions will be in effect and govern the activities of all personnel during the visit.
- a. Not a creature will stir without official permission. This will include indigenous mice. Special stirring permits for necessary administrative actions will be obtained through normal channels. Mice stirring permits will be obtained through the Office of the Surgeon General, Veterinary Services.
- b. Personnel will settle their brains for a long winter nap prior to 2200 hours, 24 December 2025. Uniform for the nap will be Pajamas, cotton, light, drowsing, with kerchief, general purpose, camouflage; and Cap, camouflage w/ear flaps. Equipment will be drawn from CIF prior to 1900 hours, 24 December 2025.
- c. Personnel will utilize standard field ration sugar plums for visions to dance through their heads. Artificially sweetened plums are authorized for those in their unit weight control program. Specifications for this item will be provided by the servicing dining facility.



- d. Stockings, wool, cushion sole, will be hung by the chimney with care. Necessary safety precautions will be taken to avoid fire hazards caused by carelessly hung stockings. Unit Safety Officers will submit stocking hanging plans to this headquarters prior to 0800 hours, 23 December 2025, ATTN: G4, for approval.
- e. At the first sign of clatter from the lawn, all troops will spring from their beds to evaluate noise and cause. Immediate action will be taken to tear open the shutters and throw open the window sashes. G4 Plan (Saint Nick), Reference LO No. 3, paragraph 6c, this headquarters, 2 February 2009, will be in effect to facilitate shutter tearing and sash throwing. Division chiefs will familiarize all personnel with procedures and are responsible for ensuring that no shutters are torn open, or window sashes thrown open prior to start of official clatter.
 - f. Prior to 2400 hrs., 24 December 2025, all

personnel will be assigned to "Wondering Eye" stations. After shutters are thrown open and sashes are torn, these stations will be manned.

- g. The G4 will assign one each Sleigh, miniature, M-66, and eight deer, rein, tiny, for use of General Claus' driver who, IAW current directives and other applicable regulations, must have a valid SF 46 properly annotated by Driver Testing; be authorized rooftop parking and be able to shout "On Dasher, on Dancer, on Prancer and Vixen, up Comet, up Cupid, on Donner and Blitzen".
- 2. General Claus will enter quarters through standard chimneys. All units without chimneys will draw Chimney Simulator, M-6, for use during ceremonies. Chimney simulators will be requested on Engineer Job Order Request Form submitted to the Furniture Warehouse prior to 23 December 2025, and issued on DA Form 3161, Request for Issue or Turn-in.
- 3. Personnel will be rehearsed shouting "Merry Christmas to all and to all a good night." This shout will be given at the end of General Claus' visit. Uniformity of shouting is the responsibility of division chiefs.
