OPERATION DESERT STORM: Operation Desert Storm: Desert Storm began on 17 January 1991.

The two phases of Operation Desert Storm were a coalition air operation and a ground offensive. 147 U.S. personnel and 47 British troops were killed in action. Approximately 1,000 coalition troops were wounded. Over 650,000 U.S. service members participated in the broader Gulf War period (Desert Shield and Desert Storm). 700,000 total personnel were involved, including approximately 470,000 active-duty troops and significant reserve/National Guard troops, making it a

massive deployment to liberate Kuwait from Iraq. Thank you to our seven members who were awarded Purple Hearts during the Persian Gulf War.

BATTLE OF THE BULGE: The Battle of the Bulge, also known as the Ardennes Offensive, was the last major German offensive campaign on the Western Front during the Second World War, taking place from 16 December 1944 to 25 January 1945. The surprise attack through the Ardennes Forest aimed to split Allied forces and capture Antwerp, Belgium. Despite initial success and creating a "bulge" in the Allied lines, American resistance at Bastogne, German resource shortages and favorable weather eventually halted the advance, leading to a decisive Allied victory,



depleting Germany's last reserves, and hastening the end of WWII in Europe. Thank you to our eighteen members who were awarded Purple Hearts during WWII.

PURPLE HEART CHAPTER CAP: Like other veteran organizations the Military Order of the Purple Heart has its own uniform cap. This distinctive purple military style cap is the basic item of the Military Order of the Purple Heart uniform. Chapter caps are purple with white piping and white lettering, with a George Washington emblem sewn on it. The chapter number and the words "Life Member" may be added with white letters as appropriate. Department and chapter officers should have the Order's official headgear. 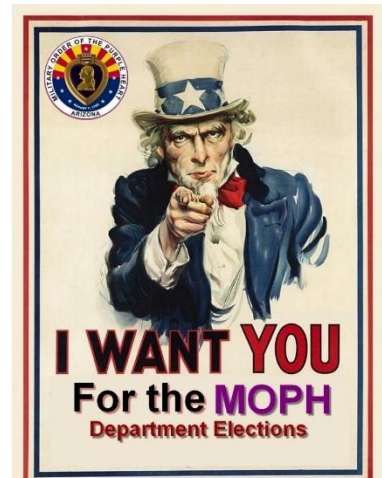

RUPTURED DUCK AWARD: John Ballenger took time to recognize George Cross, one of his neighbors, and present him with a Ruptured Duck Lapel Pin. George entered the Army at 16 and served with the 82nd Airborne Division in the Normandy Invasion. George is 101 and going strong. The "Ruptured Duck" is the popular name for the Honorable Service Lapel Button, a U.S. military award given to service members honorably discharged between 1925 and 1946, especially during WWII, to identify them as veterans and prove they weren't AWOL when wearing civilian clothes. This distinctive pin, featuring an eagle within a ring of stripes, was worn on civilian attire and became a symbol of pride, though its official name is Honorable Service Lapel Button.
