The department formally rescinded its Constitution and Bylaws dated May 30, 2020, along with all previous editions, which were outdated. This action, approved by the Department Executive Committee last year, ensures that the Department of Arizona and its chapters are governed by the National Constitution, Bylaws, and the National Procedures Manual of the Military Order of the Purple Heart. In its place the Department Executive Committee will implement a series of policy letters to govern department and chapter operation.

We established a 4-member policy committee who will author the policy letters. At our January Department Executive Committee meeting the Department

Executive Committee reviewed and approved the 1st five of these policies. Policy 2025-001 covers policy philosophy. Policy 2025-002 covers how to approve, amend, or rescind policies. Policy 2025-003 covers chapter operations. Policy 2025-004 covers financial operations. Policy 2025-005 covers welfare and disaster assistance. These policies will be presented at the Department Convention and posted to the department website. Copies of the policies can be requested from the command team or the department adjutant.

Thank you to the members of the policy committee for devoting your time to this effort. Also, I'd like to thank the Patriots of our department who will represent the Military Order of the Purple Heart at the various Four Chaplain ceremonies being held in February. Your participation in this and other veterans' events is appreciated.

Save the Date – Saturday May 2nd is the Department Convention in Tucson. More details to follow as we get closer to the convention.

I look forward to seeing everyone at our next Department Executive Committee Meeting by Zoom on February 25th. A member of the chapter command group must attend. 
Your candidate for Patriot of the Year needs to be submitted to Department by the end of February.

IWO JIMA FLAG RAISING: The Iwo Jima Flag Raising in Sacaton is an annual commemoration held in the Gila River Indian Community (GRIC), a Purple Heart Community, in Arizona. It honors Pima Indian and U.S. Marine Ira H. Hayes, one of the six men who raised the American flag on Mt. Suribachi during the 1945 Battle of Iwo Jima, and other local veterans. The event takes place at the Mathew B. Juan – Ira H. Hayes Veterans Memorial Park in Sacaton, Arizona. The

commemoration features a parade, wreath-laying ceremonies, traditional songs, and speeches honoring Native American veterans. It celebrates the legacy of Ira Hayes, a local hero from the Gila River Indian Community, and marks the anniversary of the iconic Feb. 23, 1945, flag raising. The celebration brings together veterans and families to honor the sacrifice of those who fought in World War II. See flyers further down in the newsletter for details.

PURPLE HEART CHAPTER CAP: Like other veteran organizations the Military Order of the Purple Heart has its own uniform cap. This distinctive purple military style cap is the basic item of the Military Order of the Purple Heart uniform. Chapter caps are purple with white piping and white lettering, with a George Washington emblem sewn on it. The chapter number and the words "Life Member" may be added with white letters as appropriate. Department and chapter officers should have the Order's official headgear. Four Chaplains Day is celebrated on February 3rd every year in recognition of four Army chaplains who acted in the spirit of heroic sacrifice and humanitarianism onboard a sinking ship. In recognition of their valor and guided by non-discrimination against anyone based on their religion, the Four Chaplains Memorial Foundation was set up as a way of promoting interfaith unity and a spirit of service among individuals. In 1998, a senate resolution was passed to recognize the 55th anniversary of the incident making Four Chaplains Day official.







NEW CHAPEL DEDICATED AT THE TUCSON VA HOSPITAL:


The Tucson VA Hospital proudly celebrated the grand opening and ribbon cutting of its new dedicated chapel in January.





Arizona Veterans Honor Tour Honoring Service and Community Impact

The Arizona Veterans Honor Tour, supported by a non-profit organization, is organizing a special event to honor Veterans who have served honorably and continue to make a meaningful difference in their communities. Through this event, Veterans will enjoy memorable experiences and form deeper bonds with others who share their journey. The initiative aims to create lasting memories and highlight the importance of their ongoing service in civilian life.

The Arizona Veterans Honor Tour is seeking nominations for Veterans who demonstrate dedication and selflessness in their communities. If you know a Veteran who meets these qualifications, please consider encouraging them to apply. Applicants are required to submit two separate letters of recommendation outlining their community involvement and activities.

The chosen Veterans are welcome to bring a guest over the age of 21; however, the guest's expenses must be covered by the applicant. (\$1300 double occupancy). The trip package includes airfare from Mesa, Arizona, bus transportation, hotel accommodations, meals, and entertainment.

Arizona Veterans Honor Tour is raising funds for the trip through sponsorships, grants, fundraising efforts, and support from various military organizations. Each Veteran cost is approximately \$1,300 (double occupancy), which covers all major expenses. Contributions are requested by March 31st to meet deposit requirements. Only 15 Veterans will be selected for this special honor.
