The presenter who visited us in Tucson was a former Army officer and offered their services as a way to prevent Veteran Suicide due to Financial Stressors. 

VA HOME-BASED PRIMARY CARE: Home-Based Primary Care (HBPC) teams now have a faster and more secure way to support Veterans in remote areas, even those without internet access, thanks to the recent implementation of the Oracle Health Community Care app, formerly known as Mobile Care. The app allows HBPC staff to view critical patient information, including documentation, orders, medications, labs, and histories, in an offline, read-only capacity, enabling providers to deliver consistent, high-quality care in rural or low-connectivity areas. The app also has additional features, such as essential risk assessments and offline free-text documents. More information is available at the VA Website.


The VDF funds programs that benefit Veterans and their families throughout Arizona. The Grantee should have a primary mission of providing benefits to Arizona's Veterans and is



VA COMMUNITY CARE: VA Community Care Just Got Easier. The Department of Veterans Affairs has changed its process for veterans to get medical care from non-VA providers, removing a requirement that a referral to community care be reviewed by another VA doctor. The VA announced that it is enacting a provision of the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act that will help ease veterans' access to medical services from private providers. The law, signed in December by then-President Joe Biden, prohibits VA administrators from overriding a VA doctor's referral for a patient to get outside care. More info is at this link.
