



HB 2062 Vehicle license tax exemption for PH










Presents for Phoenix VA Living Center: For the past nine years, **Jim and Karen Starkman** (Chapter 691 member and associate) have been



heading a project to collect presents for Veterans in VA homes and transitional housing organizations. A few years prior, the project was started by the Sun City West Sun Dome Plaza Merchants setting up two Christmas Angel Trees for Veterans. The Corte Bella Vets were asked to take over the

project when their contacts could not keep up.Jim and Karen immediately took charge and have grown the project from two trees to seven! Presents and gift cards have been donated from the Sun City West residents visiting the plaza. Jim has also expanded the volunteer force as needed to collect, package as needed and distribute the gifts to five different locations.

This year, through the auspices of Veterans Affinity, another non-profit, Jim added the Phoenix VA Living Center which is a 100-bed facility with 75 Veterans currently in residence. He also enlisted the help of the Blue Star Moms which made hand-



made Christmas cards to accompany the gifts to the Veterans in the Center.

This year alone, Jim and Karen, with the help of other volunteers like **John and Carol Ballenger** (Chapter 691), were able to deliver gifts totaling over \$75,000. 





Applicants can also request one-time emergency assistance for a maximum of \$3,000. MFRF is open to both pre and post 9/11 service members.
