WHEREAS, The Purple Heart is the oldest military decoration still in present use and was initially created by George Washington in 1782, as the "Badge of Military Merit"; and

WHEREAS, The Purple Heart was the first American Service Award made available to the common soldier, and is awarded to any member of the United States Armed Services wounded or killed in combat with a declared enemy of the United States; and

WHEREAS, The mission of The Military Order of the Purple Heart, chartered by an act of Congress, is to foster an environment of goodwill among the combat-wounded veteran members and their families; to promote patriotism; to support related initiatives; and to make sure we never forget the sacrifices made by those so decorated; and

WHEREAS, There have been many Glendale residents who made the ultimate sacrifice in the giving of their lives in the cause of freedom, and there are combat-wounded veterans who currently reside within the City, and Purple Heart awardees who contribute to their community in countless ways; and

WHEREAS, Arizona became a Purple Heart State on May 9th, 2016;
